MULTILINGUAL PARENTS: SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING:

There are many ways parents can <u>support their child's learning and get engaged in their education</u>. A resource that helps to support your child's teacher(s) plan and monitor English language learning is STEP (Steps to English Proficiency). Ask your child's teacher about their English language learning (STEP) and the help they are receiving. Another way you may support your child's learning is to share information about your child's experiences within and outside of school, including interests, strengths and goals. Questions parents may want to ask the principal or teacher:

- What is my child's English language level and how is it assessed?
- How is their English learning being monitored?
- How are you supporting their English language learning and academic success.

FROM THE BDHS LEARNING COMMONS:

Meditation/Multi-Faith Prayer Room

BDHS has a room dedicated to individual multi-faith prayer and/or meditation. This small room is in the Learning Commons and students are welcome to use it at any time.

LITERACY TEST (OSSLT):

The Ministry of Education has once again confirmed that schools will be permitted to offer students both a Fall and Spring opportunity to write the literacy test. Passing of either the Literacy Test or the Literacy Course constitutes the required literacy requirement for earning an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. To ensure that BDHS students are well prepared to write this Fall, students are being provided with various practice and preparation opportunities. Homeroom teachers are currently working with students to do a practice online session to familiarize themselves with the online test. Students are also being provided with special tutorial sessions to prepare for the long answer questions found on the Literacy Test.

Finally, a Google Classroom has been created with materials to help students prepare for the OSSLT. Students can join this classroom by using the joining code: "cfkrscn". Any students needing support joining the Google Classroom can connect with Mrs. Sparks in the Library.

APPRENTICESHIPS AND SKILLED TRADE VIRTUAL EVENT:

Parents/guardians and students invited to learn about planning for the skilled trades at virtual event on Dec. 1.

Are you not fully sold on the skilled trades as a career? Not everyone is. On Thursday, Dec. 1 at 7 p.m., participants in What our School Families Need to Know About Skilled Trades Careers will learn about apprenticeship pathways and can hear how to best explore a career in the trades while still in high school. Parents/guardians and Grade 7 to 12 students can consider what one employment researcher has discovered about contradictory perspectives on skilled trades careers. He will share findings based on interviews with hundreds of tradespeople and reveal the results of surveying 500 parents/guardians.

This interactive virtual evening, presented by the Simcoe County District School Board, will feature Dr. Jon Callegher, Executive Director at Job Talks, and will include information about apprenticeship, tech ed in our schools, cooperative education, and

BDHS - MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT:

Everyone has mental health. Staying connected to supports during the school year is important if you find yourself struggling with your mental health. Many students find talking about their experiences is essential to supporting and enhancing their well-being, coping, sense of belonging and readiness to learn.

If students are interested in counselling, there are several options that can be accessed through BDHS. Larissa Broadbent is a Registered Social Worker who can provide brief counselling that is free and confidential at the school. We also have Beth Mulvale who is an Adolescent Outreach Worker from New Path that can provide more long term counselling at the school (Wednesdays). Referrals to other community programs such as the Mental Health and Addictions Nurse (MHAN), Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA), New Path and other community providers are also available. Please reach out to your Guidance Counselor, SERT, or Admin if you are interested in a referral for mental health support.

BDHS ATTENDANCE REMINDERS:

Student Absences

If it is necessary for students to be absent from school because of illness or any other reason, they will be marked as an unknown absence until the absence has been reported to the school. The preferred method of communication for absences is through the attendance line 905-775-2262 option 1 or email bdhattendance@scdsb.on.ca. Absences reported to teachers via email may not be recorded as an excused absence and will prompt an automated attendance call home at day's end. Absences must be reported by parents/guardians until the student reaches the age of 18. Students who are 18 or older may have the privilege of signing themselves out. If the student signs out of school, they are expected to leave the school premises.

Appointments During the Day

Appointments happen and we are aware of that! However, to avoid unnecessary classroom interruption please provide as much notice as possible to have your student contacted and excused from the class. If office staff are given notice about an appointment, staff can email the teacher to have the student excused, rather than interrupting valuable teaching time with phone calls. Your co-operation with this process is appreciated.

FEEDBACK, RECOVERY AND IMPROVEMENT DAYS (FOR SECONDARY ONLY):

At the end of each semester, all secondary schools will run feedback, recovery and improvement days for students. Culminating assessments such as portfolios, essays, examinations, and interviews will take place during instructional days and will be returned to students with feedback.

The last day of regular instruction for students in semester one is Monday, Jan. 30, 2023. The period from Tuesday, Jan. 31 to Thursday, Feb. 2, 2023 is reserved for students who require an opportunity to receive feedback from an assessment, to rescue or recover a credit, or to improve on an area of missed expectations. Teachers and support staff will communicate with students who will benefit most from attending this opportunity; however, all students will be invited to attend. There will be no new instruction these days. Feedback, recovery and improvement days are an opportunity for students to work closely with their teacher if they require feedback, credit recovery or an opportunity to improve on an area of missed expectations.

TREATIES RECOGNITION WEEK TAKES PLACE NOVEMBER 6 TO 12:

Features include an interactive whiteboard, as well as voice and text chat to make it easy to upload a math question and figure it out with the support of a math tutor, at a time that works for you.

Connect with an Ontario Certified Teacher of your choice. It is anonymous and secure, and can be used from a phone, tablet or computer. Math tutors are available from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday to Friday, and 3:30 to 9 p.m. Sunday. All SCDSB students from Grades 4 to 12 have been pre-registered for this amazing service.
