

#### **TIMETABLE CHANGE REQUESTS FOR THE 2023/24 SCHOOL YEAR:**

It is projected that student timetables will be ready on **Monday**, **June 12th**. Students will be able to view this timetable in their student portal. Any student needing/wanting a change will sign up using a Microsoft Form that will be sent out that day to all student emails. Students will have until the end of that week (June 16<sup>th</sup>) to sign up to be seen about a timetable change. Necessary changes will be prioritized, otherwise this opportunity will be first-come-first served, and Guidance counsellors will meet with students in the order in which they signed up. Requested timetable changes will be addressed over 2 weeks, from **June 12<sup>th</sup> through to Friday**, **June 23rd**. Students will require *parent approval* to make changes. If students are not in class when Guidance calls them down, they will move onto the next student on the list.

Please bear in mind that not all course requests can be accommodated. In order to best support timetable change requests, timetable changes need to be addressed now before the end of this school year.

Guidance will not be accommodating any timetable changes after June 23rd and for at least the first week of school in September.

# FEEDBACK, RECOVERY & IMPROVEMENT DAYS

At the end of each semester, all secondary schools will run feedback, recovery, and improvement days for students. Culminating assessments such as portfolios, essays, examinations, and interviews will take place during instructional days and will be returned to students with feedback.

The last day of regular instruction for students in semester two is Friday, June 23. The period from Monday, June 26 to Wednesday, June 28 is reserved for students to receive feedback from an assessment, to rescue or recover a credit, or to improve on an area of missed expectations. Teachers and support staff will communicate with students who will benefit most from attending this opportunity; however, all students will be invited to attend. There will be no new instruction these days. Feedback, recovery, and improvement days are an opportunity for students to work closely with their teacher if they require feedback, credit recovery, or an opportunity to improve on an area of missed expectations.

#### Registration now open for summer eLearning!

The Simcoe County District School Board (SCDSB) is offering summer school courses in July 2023 for current high school students or adult learners who are interested in earning a new credit or upgrading a previous mark. #### **READING WITH SORA**

Sora is the SCDSB's digital ebook library which is available to all students from K-12. Each year, Sora has a collection of diverse ebooks and audiobooks (juvenile to young adult) curated into a collection called Sora Sweet Reads. The best part of this collection is that each title is simultaneous use, meaning that there are unlimited copies available so there are no holds on the titles! Simply use your school Google login and password to access the library. We hope that this collection will encourage students to stay engaged in reading even when the weather gets warmer. ### FOUR FINGER AFFIRMATIONS COPING STRATEGY

Well-being is a strategic priority in the Simcoe County District School Board, and our well-being department provides monthly strategies to support student and family well-being.

This month's strategy is four finger affirmations. Parents/guardians can guide their child to think positively in the face of stress or challenges by using affirmations to promote confidence, a growth mindset, self-regulation, and resiliency. To practice four finger affirmations at home, work with your child to generate four words that make them feel calm and confident. For example, "I am loved today" or "breathe, listen, smile, love." Explain that each word will match a finger on their hand. Have them say the words (affirmation) aloud or in their head and connect each finger with their thumb. Tell your child they can repeat this as many times as they like, to themselves or out loud.

Consider practicing four finger affirmations at home with your child at a time of day that will be most helpful for them. #### REPORTING IMMUNIZATIONS

Parents/guardians are responsible for reporting their child's immunizations to public health to keep records up-to-date per standards of the Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA) (<a href="https://ontario.ca/laws/regulation/900645">ontario.ca/laws/regulation/900645</a>) and the Child Care and Early Years Act (<a href="https://ontario.ca/laws/regulation/150137#BK46">ontario.ca/laws/regulation/150137#BK46</a>). Please note, health care providers in Ontario do not automatically report immunizations to their local public health unit. Reporting and viewing immunizations is easy and can be done online.
